EXPLORE WITH YOUR FAMILY:

As you are in the car, have family members think of things they deserve from a good job to a good grade in school. Instead of saying them aloud, give clues to what you are thinking and allow others to guess. When everyone has had a turn, relate this to how we sometimes think because we are good or go to church, we deserve what God gives. Talk about how that is not true. We receive God's grace, His undeserved favor, not because of anything we do, but because of what Jesus did for us on the cross.
