



Spiritual growth isn't measured in a test, and it isn't about facts. Knowledge is important, but unless we teach kids to apply that knowledge to their relationship with God, it's only a bunch of facts about someone they cannot see, feel or touch.

It's a **RELATI NSHIP**.

It's a JOURNEY.

### It's Intentional.

Building a strong faith is about growing a personal relationship with God.



# A child's faith grows deeper and stronger in God as they...

- 1. Hear from God. (conversation = relationship). We remind kids that the primary way God speaks to us today is through His Word, the Bible. So, if we're not spending time in God's Word at home and at church, chances are—we're not going to hear His voice. It takes practice.
- 2. Pray to God.
- 3. Talk about God and their faith in God. Talking about their faith helps kids *own* their faith.

Kids today process truth by talking it out with others.

- They talk about their problems with safe leaders and peers and they begin to hear how other kids are handling the same issues with God's help.
- As they hear from others and learn to converse about their own faith—struggles and wins—their faith in God begins to grow.
- Why? Because they can hear how God is working in other people's lives and they begin to see that God is real and personal.

This is why we are intentional here at church to make sure learning is active, hands on and involves every learner. We're striving to promote an atmosphere of discovery rather than simply listening.

4. Live—Worship. Giving. Serving. This goes beyond singing, praising or even thanking God for what He's done. This is where our kids put feet to the lessons they are learning from the Bible.

### **Practical Application Examples:**

- I can make the wise choice because that's what God wants me to do.
- I can care about this person who's not like me at all because Jesus cared about every person.
- I will tell the truth because God is truthful, and I'm made in His image.
- I can obey my mom because God says this is what's best for my life and by obeying my parents (authorities) I'm practicing obeying God.
- I serve and give to God's purposes because He loves every person and He wants to meet their needs through me.



### Five Goals for Rock Solid Kids Ministry

- 1. To create a fun, safe atmosphere where your child feels loved, completely accepted and free to learn how to have a relationship with God. This includes large group worship times and small groups where kids can open up and be honest about their growing faith in God.
- 2. To create an awareness of God's presence, power and the importance of His Word through intimate times of worship and Bible study. In teaching, we will be intentional to **incite wonder and promote discovery** in kids as they study God's Word with us.
- 3. To be a helping hand and a support to you, as parents by:
  - Praying for you and for your child.
  - Providing resources that help you grow as parents, as you point your children toward a personal relationship with God.

<sup>4</sup> "Listen, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. <sup>5</sup> And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength. <sup>6</sup> And you must commit yourselves wholeheartedly to these commands that I am giving you today. <sup>7</sup> Repeat them again and again to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up. <sup>8</sup> Tie them to your hands and wear them on your forehead as reminders. <sup>9</sup> Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

- 4. To be an encouraging presence in your life as you become the Godly family God intended. We'll be your biggest cheerleaders!
- 5. To present the gospel of Jesus Christ faithfully to your child on regular occasions and be available to help you with their spiritual journey as needed.

### SUNDAYS - SUNDAY SCHOOL

### > 1st - 4th Grades and Kids Worship

We use Bible Studies for Life: Kids (BSLK) by Lifeway for  $1^{st} - 4^{th}$  Grade. As kids grow, their understanding of foundational truths grows with them. That's why BSLK is built on the Levels of Biblical Learning. The curriculum is designed around the way kids learn best and ensures your son/daughter has a transformative, age-appropriate encounter with God's Word.

### > 5th - 6th Grades

Today's preteens stay on the move; if we're not reaching them, someone or something else will. **FLYTE** is a Bible study curriculum for kids ages 10-12, one that speaks to what they're dealing with right now - not what's past or in their future. FLYTE encourages preteens to come up with answers to some of the most difficult situations they may face. Guided Bible study pages keep preteens interacting with Scripture as they learn how God's view and the world's view of a particular subject is not the same. Situational studies enable preteens to identify with concepts and scripturally based activities keep them interacting with the world around them. ### CHECK IN:


### **CAMP PASTOR**

### Philadelphia Preteen Summer Camp Paid Chaperone Policy

In this policy, the purpose of a chaperone is to be a regular volunteer in the Kids Ministry. This person should be someone who is currently building relationships and connecting with the preteens in the Rock Solid Kids Ministry to make a difference in their lives.

The selection of the paid chaperones for Preteen Summer Camps will be determined on a "first come, first served" basis by email to <a href="mailton:marilyn@pbcministry.com">marilyn@pbcministry.com</a> applied in the over-all structure of the following "serving tier". E-mails requesting to be selected as a paid chaperone will only be accepted the day after the dates for camp have been officially announced and published. If an eligible person is not able to attend, then the next person on the list will be given the next opportunity to be a paid chaperone.

### Philadelphia Baptist Travel Safety Procedures

- 1. Driver safety training for all drivers (bus & van).
- 2. Passengers in seats at all times and in seat belts (bus & van).
- 3. Driver co-pilot system The co-pilot is boss. (This person would be awake the entire time the driver is driving, and is responsible for watching the driver for alertness and helping the driver with any communication and navigation. If the driver seems fatigued in any way, the co-pilot is boss and will "pull" the driver to rest. The co-pilot must not be a spouse or related to the driver.) Transporting out of state requires a co-pilot. A co-pilot is not necessary for 10 passengers or less in state.
- 4. A driver must not exceed a maximum of 10 hours driving time and 15 hours trip time per day. 8 hours of rest is required (bus & van).
- 5. Chaperones are responsible for enforcing PBC rules on buses or vans.
- 6. The PBC Travel Safety Checklist must be completed and signed before a vehicle leaves the campus that makes sure that precautions have been taken. This would include:
  - A. Pre-trip passenger orientation.
  - B. Pre-trip chaperone orientation.
  - C. Pre-trip vehicle inspections by driver.
  - D. Manifest preparation.
  - E. Parent/Guardian Consent Forms copies with:
    - 1. Church
    - 2. Minister/Director in charge
    - 3. A key leader on trip
  - F. Walkie Talkies for Co-pilots.
  - G. GPS/Directions and Stops or Pre-planned route planned.
  - H. Log book for any trip exceeding 150 road miles one way.
- 7. Any out of state trips with 2 or more vehicles requires 3 drivers. Any out of state trips with 1 vehicle requires 2 drivers.
- 8. Proper rest and nutrition required for all drivers.

6. My words will be kind and build up all children and fellow leaders.

**Explanation:** What we say at home may not be appropriate for *all* of our children. As Rock Solid Kidz Ministry leaders, we don't use slang in front of our kids. We do not use God's name in vain—or anything that even sounds close. We don't say c....p, c...d, freakin', "omg," "what the..." (the next word people hear in their heads after the start of that phrase is "hell.") (Matthew 12:36; 1 Peter 1:15-16)

7. I will discipline children with love and GRACE. (Proverbs 16:24)
One RSK relationship goal is: As leaders, we don't raise our voices in ministry unless the kids are in danger and we need to get their attention quickly. One goal in RSK is: our church environment will be the safest, most loving environment possible. Kids will feel welcomed and loved—not scolded. The goal of discipline is to draw the child closer to Christ, not make them feel shame or hurt.

- 13. I will limit cell phone usage at RSK events so our kids will see I am committed to limiting distractions in order to grow closer to Christ.
